70th MAAA NATS

The 70th MAAA Australian National Championships will be held at West Wyalong from 23rd April to 30th April. LSF Levels and ESAP

In 2016 the League of Silent Flight ratified that electric gliders could be used to achieve any of the LSF Levels. Read the ESAP doc which outlines how you can achieve any of the LSF Levels 1-5 with an electric glider. Contrary to what I said in the September LSF Newsletter, further dialogue with LSF USA has revealed that the glider and electric programs are standalone programs. You can be an LSF member by achieving Level One with a glider or you can achieve Level One by using an electric glider. We welcome the use of both types of models and encourage new members flying electric gliders to embrace the LSF Achievement program.

We have been in touch with the Executive of LSF USA in an effort to streamline the recognition of Achievement Levels. There has just been an election in the US and we hope that communications with the newly elected officials will be more fruitful.

F5J Worlds

F5J electric glider is the fastest growing FAI class in the world, and the scheduling of the 1st World Championships for F5J in Trnava, Slovakia in 2019 can only add to that enthusiasm. LSF Australia, as the Special Interest Group (SIG) recognised by the MAAA, was tasked to organise

the Team Selection trials for the 3 person Australian team to attend this 2019 event. There are also 3 spots available for Juniors.

After receiving bids for events to include in the trial process, the LSF Executive has decided upon the trial process which you will find in **f5JTeamSelection.pdf**
